MPHA CALL FOR ABSTRACT PRESENTATION PROPOSALS

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES:

Students and professionals are invited to submit abstracts of their work for presentation at the at the annual meeting of the Mississippi Public Health Association (MPHA) using the following online submission portal:

All presentation abstracts must be received by **September 20, 2024, at 11:59 PM.** Abstracts will be peer-reviewed, and participants will be notified of their acceptance status by **September 27, 2024.**

PROFESSIONALS:

MPHA invites professional and academic researchers from all sectors of public health to submit abstracts of their current research.

To be eligible to present, professionals must become a **regular member of MPHA prior to the meeting.** Regular membership dues are \$30 per year. Professional presenters must register to attend the conference. Click here to become a member of MPHA.

STUDENTS:

MPHA invites undergraduate, graduate, and medical students to submit abstracts of their current research. MPHA will accept abstracts for a broad range of topics but does not accept case reports. If selected, students will be given the opportunity to develop their abstract into a poster presentation for the student research competition which will be judged by a panel, and 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place prizes will be awarded. Students who participate in the research competition will have their conference registration fee waived and a gift card that they can apply to their lodging or their poster preparation expenses.

To be eligible, students must attend a college or university located in Mississippi and/or be an intern with an institution located in the state. Student presenters must become a Student Member of MPHA prior to the Conference (student dues are \$12.00 per year). <u>Click here to become a student member of MPHA</u>.

STEPS FOR SUBMISSION:

Step 1: Submit your abstract for review by the MPHA Submission Review Committee on or before **9/20/2024 at 11:59 PM** using the form found here:

Use the FORMATTING GUIDELINES provided within this document to structure your abstract submission.

Step 2: An email confirmation will be sent acknowledging receipt of the submission after the deadline.

Step 3: Authors of all submissions (students and professionals) will be notified of their proposal acceptance status by 9/27/24.

Step 4: If selected, professionals and students will develop their abstract into a poster to be presented at the conference. **Professionals will present their poster on Thursday November 14, 2024. Students will present their posters on Friday November 15, 2024.** The times for the poster sessions will be provided upon acceptance.

Information Required to be Entered into the Portal

Title: Include the title from your project.

Name of Author(s): Include the name of each author and their institution/organization.

Abstract that contains 250 words or less, excluding the title and section headings: Background/Purpose: Provide a background or purpose (reason) for conducting the research, project, and/or study.

Methods: Ensure that methods and materials used to conduct the project are identified. **Results:** Provide main findings of the project and/or study. This section may also include data analyses.

Implications for Public Health: Provide a summary of how the results may be used for future public health practice.

PLEASE NOTE: Abstract submissions must contain 250 words or less, excluding title/section headings. In the submission portal you will also be asked to list authors who contributed to the work and their organizational affiliations.

POSTER PRESENTATION FORMATING GUIDELINES:

Posters should be no more than 3 feet by 4 feet (you may use either landscape or portrait orientation). The poster headings should be the same as in the abstract. Be sure to use a font size that can be read from 4-6 feet away. Posters should be prepared to exhibit on pipe and drape rather than an easel.
